The Virginia Dominion Energy Envirothon is a natural resources competition that tests teams on soils, forestry, aquatics, wildlife and a special topic chosen each year that allows the students to work to solve real world environmental problems. This year's Virginia Dominion Energy Local Envirothon Competition event sponsored by the Eastern Shore Soil and Water Conservation District and partly funded by Dominion Energy occurred in two days — an intense day of training and a testing day at the Herbert H. Bateman Educational & Administrative Center at the Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, Assateague, VA. All local high schools participated including Arcadia High School (Coach Marianne Simko), Broadwater Academy (two teams— Coach Sandra Thornton), Chincoteague High School (Coach Fred Gers), Nandua High School (Coach Julie Head) and Northampton High Schools (two teams—Coach Kelsey Gaskins and Coach Andrea McCready).

Arcadia High School placed first and Broadwater Academy placed second at this year's

Local Dominion Energy Envirothon Competition. Arcadia High School and Broadwater Academy both competed at the Area VI Envirothon at Virginia State University's Randolph Farm in Petersburg, VA. Arcadia High School placed third and will head to the State competition at Ferrum College, on May 20-21, 2018.

Advanced American Spies & Nature Detectives Camp (**July 30 – August 3, 2018 from 9am – 4pm for ages 9-13**) is a joint presentation of the Eastern Shore Soil and Water Conservation District and the Historical Society. It challenges 21st century campers to use their powers of observation, deception and imagination in Spy training. Nature Detectives will hone their observation skills and look closer at the world around them to discover nature's mysteries. Campers will create advanced codes, complete reconnaissance assignments, master the art of disguise, learn to travel behind enemy lines, learn to identify animal tracks, birds and trees as well as mastering solar cooking techniques. The week culminates in the completion of a mission and some intriguing arts and crafts.

Spring Grants Awarded

The Eastern Shore Soil and Water Conservation District Endowment Committee **awarded \$2,500 in Spring Grants** this year. These grants are funding small but far-reaching and long-term educational projects.

This year the grants are funding a Monarch Waystation for Parks and Rec, Butterfly Garden Expansion for Arcadia High School Ecology Club, a field trip to the VA Living Museum for Kiptopeke Elementary students, a Butterfly Lifecycle Project for Accawmacke Elementary, a pre-K Pollinator Garden and Insect Project for Broadwater Academy, a film called Hometown Habitat for Master Gardeners, Field trip to VA Living

Museum for Kiptopeke Elementary, a garden classroom for Metompkin Elementary, equipment for nature on the Big Screen for Friends of Kiptopeke State Park (KSP), Birding in the Building project at Kegotank Elementary, a Migrant Student Bird Program for Friends of KSP and Raised Bed Soil Monitors for New Roots Youth Garden. Educators use these projects to teach environmental conservation in a way that brings science to life for children.













T-shirt Design Contest



Spring Watershed Festival

On Thursday, April 12, 2018, 140 6th graders from Broadwater Academy, Kiptopeke Elementary, Occohannock Elementary, Montessori Children's House of Franktown, Cape Charles Christian School and Shore Christian Academy visited Kiptopeke State Park (KSP) for the 2018 Northampton Watershed Festival. The Watershed Festival is one segment of a three-part Meaningful Watershed Educational Experience sponsored by the Eastern Shore Environmental Education Council under the umbrella of the District. Students focused on how humans' use of the watershed can impact various aspects negatively or positively. At KSP students rotated through stations including soils, water quality, wildlife, planning & zoning and a watershed history hike. Information and data collected at KSP aided students in creating presentations on how 33 acres of land at KSP should be developed.
