## State Envirothon Founded by Eastern Shore SWCD

The Eastern Shore Soil and Water Conservation District (ESSWCD) has been a leader in environmental education since its first meeting on January 4, 1946. The mission statement is to "Develop leadership in natural resource conservation on the Eastern Shore of Virginia through technical assistance, education, the promotion of co-operative programs and meeting the needs of diverse clients". Long before the 2000 mandate of providing a "meaningful watershed experience" to all students and Richard Louv's 2005 book "Last Child in the Woods", ESSWCD has been involved in educating the general public, including our children, on ways to help conserve the Shore's unique and valuable natural resources.

In the early 1980's, the District hired its first Education Director, Billie Lou Fitzgerald. She introduced the District to many environmental education programs that were being conducted in other conservation districts across the Nation including teacher training, the Conservation Poster Contest for all school age children and the Envirothon. Originally called the Environmental Olympics, the Envirothon was established by one Pennsylvanian county in 1979.

It is a hands-on, outdoor educational program which today is an international competition reaching over 500,000 high school students nationally.

Envirothon teams consist of five members and up to two alternates. Throughout the year each team develops their skills in the following disciplines: Aquatics, Forestry, Soils, Wildlife and a team oral presentation (on an environmental issue that varies every year). During their training and studies, they often receive help from their Soil and Water District along with environmental leaders such as professional foresters, soil scientists, and wildlife experts.

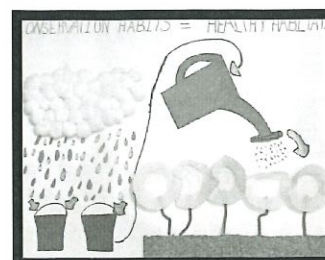
In 1992, with the help of Robin Rich-Coates (an ESSWCD Director), Sally Richardson (Northampton High science teacher), and Billie convinced local schools to create teams and support the program. They found financial support from the Joy Foundation for Ecological Education and Research, Chincoteague, VA. In 1993 Arcadia, Chincoteague, Nandua and Northampton participated in the first Envirothon competition in Virginia. Billie had experts from the Virginia Institute of Marine

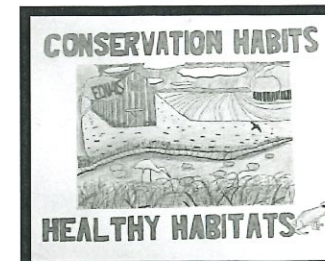

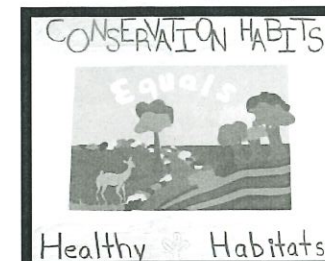

### Envirothon Founded

...Science, Dept. of Forestry-Accomac Office, Chincoteague National Wildlife Refuge, Eastern Shore Soil and Water and USDA Soil Conservation Service help with the training and testing of the teams. This first District training and competition was held at Kiptopeke State Park on April 28 and May 13 respectively. Northampton won the competition and went to the National Competition at Niagara Falls where they took first place for the rookie teams.

In 1994 other teams in the Tidewater Area (Area VI) entered the competition. Northampton High had won first place, with Nandua placing second, in our District competition but Nandua Nature Nurturers (N3) placed 1st in the Area competition and thus represented Virginia at the National level. This resulted in Virginia changing their rules in 1995 so that only one team from each district could compete at the area competition. Billie served as the Envirothon Coordinator and contact person for Virginia. She was called on to help with the

1995 State Competition arrangements at Douthat State Park near Clifton Forge on May 24, the first true state competition.

The Eastern Shore SWCD has remained a leader in this program. The current Education Director, Tamsey Ellis, has been the author of three of the last four special issues. This year's special topic was "Groundwater Protection through Agricultural, Urban and Environmental Planning". Northampton County was used for the background information. From this small grassroots beginning of four local schools and three determined women on the Eastern Shore, all 47 Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Districts now participate in the State Envirothon. It should be noted that the 21st annual Eastern Shore Envirothon held on April 12, 2010, ended with Northampton taking first place. Nandua 2nd and Arcadia placing 3rd. The Northampton team advanced to the State competition in Wirtz, VA at the Skelton 4-H Center on Smith Mountain Lake, May 16-17, 2010. In the statewide competition,

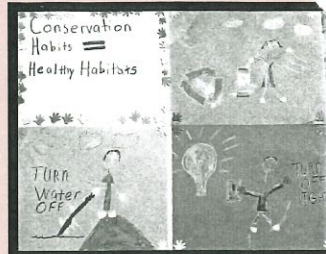


Pictured below is a group picture of the outstanding 2010 high school Envirothon teams on the Shore. Can you find someone you know?

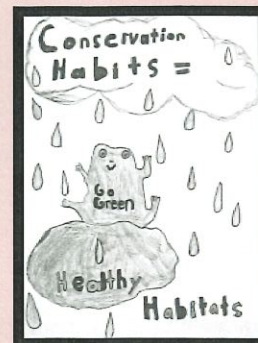
### Environmental Education Council Awarded

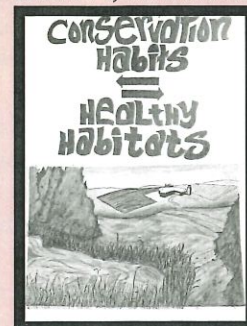

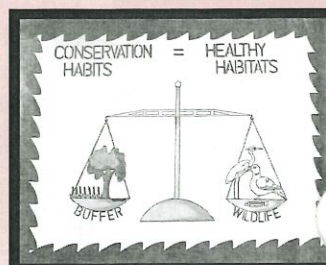

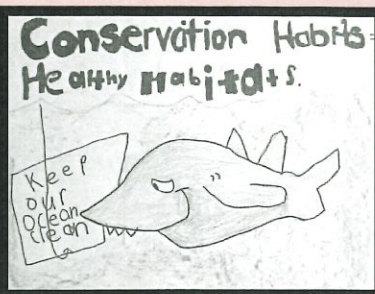

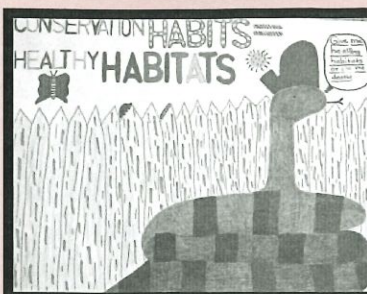

### State Envirothon Founded

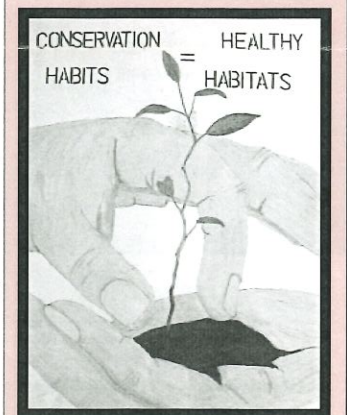
...Northampton High placed 3rd in the Oral Presentation and 7th in the State Overall category. Congratulations, Northampton!

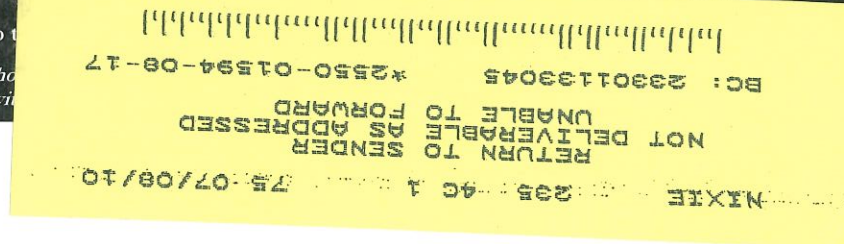
