# Classroom Programs



## New 4th and 5th Grade Programs

At the request of 4th and 5th grade teachers from Accawmacke and Chincoteague Elementary Schools, the District's Education Director has developed a number of new programs aimed at 4th and 5th grade SOL's.

**Graphing the Ocean Floor** - Students learn about the ocean floor and its features while also practicing their graphing skills.

**Dichotomous Keys** - Students practice using dichotomous keys while also learning about local creatures including reptiles, insects, and marine creatures.

**Food Webs** - students learn about food webs using local organisms.

**Wind and Water Power** - students will use critical thinking skills to design and engineer a structure that is capable of lifting objects using wind or water power.

**Natural Resources** - using everyday objects, students must determine which natural resource they come from

**Weather Stations and Rainfall** - Students act as rainfall stations and then graph their results across the Eastern Shore.

**Deadline: Friday, March 31, 2023**



Are you or your organization involved in environmental education on Virginia's Eastern Shore? Do you need funds to help provide these opportunities? You might want to apply for the Billie Fitzgerald Memorial Conservation Grants through the ESSWCD. Schools, teachers, scouts, community groups and other organizations in Accomack and Northampton Counties are eligible to apply.

Funding up to \$400 is available for projects such as outdoor classrooms, nature trails, storm drain stenciling, recycling programs, butterfly gardens, birdfeeders, worm composters, rain gardens, or other environmental projects. We do not fund beautification projects, food, or textbooks.

Deadline: Friday, March 31, 2023






